ARIHE SYMPOSIUM

This fall's ARIHE gathering will include a one and half day (Friday morning to Saturday noon) symposium on Spiritual Formation in Reformed higher education. The first half of the symposium, led by Dr. James K. A. Smith (philosophy, Calvin College), will discuss foundational themes from his *Desiring the Kingdom, Worship, Worldview and Cultural Formation* (Baker, 2009) for the purpose of concretely embodying these themes on the Reformed Christian campus. The second half of the symposium will explore more specific issues related to spiritual formation on our campuses. The goal of this symposium is to correlate the daily "in the trenches" work of spiritual formation on our campuses with foundational themes in Reformed philosophy and theology.



We encourage the following persons from member institutions to participate: presidents, provosts, VPAs, VP Student Services, campus pastors/chaplains, deans of students, student life staff, professors and others who have an interest in holistic spiritual formation on the Reformed university campus.
